

Transportation Safety - Driving in Adverse Weather





Driving in adverse weather, such as fog, snow, rain and storm, presents more challenges compared to normal weather. These conditions can severely impair visibility.

Wet or ice/snow covered roads will require **greater distance for braking.** Driving over the water puddle can lead to **hydroplaning** and skidding, which may then cause a **jack-knife.**

Thus **speed**, **space** and **visibility** play major roles in **safe driving** during adverse weather.



Safe Driving Tips



- ✓ Properly use vehicle lighting system, fog and warning lights will make your vehicle more visible.
- ✓ Install tyres designed for snow when driving on icy or snowy road.
- ✓ Reduce speed to allow for safer steering manoeuvre and braking.
- ✓ Allow a greater separation distance (2X of normal road condition) between your vehicle and the one ahead.
- ✓ Pull over and stay safe when encountering extreme weather.
