

Transportation Safety - Driving in Adverse Weather

**Caution**

Driving in **adverse weather**, such as fog, snow, rain and storm, presents **more challenges** compared to **normal weather**. These conditions can **severely impair visibility**.

Wet or ice/snow covered roads will require **greater distance for braking**. Driving over the water puddle can lead to **hydroplaning** and skidding, which may then cause a **jack-knife**.

Thus **speed**, **space** and **visibility** play major roles in **safe driving** during adverse weather.

**TIPS**

- ✓ Properly use **vehicle lighting system**, fog and warning lights will make your vehicle more visible.
- ✓ Install **tyres designed for snow** when driving on icy or snowy road.
- ✓ **Reduce speed** to allow for **safer steering manoeuvre** and **braking**.
- ✓ Allow a **greater separation distance (2X of normal road condition)** between your vehicle and the one ahead.
- ✓ **Pull over and stay safe** when encountering **extreme weather**.
