

Seminars -**Picking up momentum in 2010**

ince 2009 the shift in focus has been to co-organise the seminars in Asia in conjunction with the national associations based on their selected agendas.

2010 saw a dramatic pickup in momentum. We have completed five seminars with the national associations.

Attendance were very good at all the seminars. The two ESG seminars drew close to 200 participants each. The Acetylene seminars in Indonesia and Malaysia drew 120 and 160 participants respectively. The Medical Gases Seminar in Thailand had about 140 participants.

Feedbacks have been positive. Local speakers have made a notable presence in all the seminars. Some spoke in the native language and this helped to engage the audience more effectively. However, AIGA still had to draw on external speakers from the region to support the locals, in particularly, in the area of Electronic Specialty Gases.

The associations had taken on a more active role in organising these meetings and everything turned out smoothly. The experience they have gained will help them to run progammes of their own in the future.

However, AIGA resources are limited and prioritising the seminars will be necessary. For new topic areas, a longer lead time of 18 months may be required for the preparation. AIGA


support the future growth of Indonesian Industry.

A broad representation from the Industrial Gases, Gas equipment manufacturers and various industrial sectors will be presenting in the 2-day Seminar.






